2025 FAIRPORT MARDI GRAS SECURITY REPORT:



The Fairport Harbor Police Department is pleased to report that the final 2025 Fairport Mardi Gras concluded without any significant incidents directly related to the event. This is a notable improvement compared to last year, when security was a heightened priority due to a trend of juvenile-related disturbances at public gatherings across the region.

One of the most noticeable changes this year was the large crowd drawn by the fireworks display—significantly higher attendance than in recent years. To address both safety and perception, we implemented a strategy of deploying security personnel in highly visible positions across the event footprint. This proactive approach helped deter unwanted behavior and reassured attendees of a safe and secure environment.

Post-fireworks traffic control was generally effective, although we experienced moderate congestion on the east side of the village, particularly along Fairport Nursery Road. Despite the higher turnout, these issues were manageable and resolved in a timely manner.

While Mardi Gras itself remained incident-free, our officers did respond to an increased volume of routine service calls throughout the village on the day of the event. These were unrelated to the festival but reflect the additional demands placed on our department.

We thank our officers, support personnel, and community partners for their professionalism and teamwork throughout the event.
